

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FREEDOM FIGHTER ROPLO KOLHI

The Karoonjhar Mountain is usually referred to as Nangarparkar's diamond, and Roplo is not just the diamond of Karoonjhar or Nangarparkar, but also the hero of Sindh. In 1820, he was born in Nangarparkar's Kunbhari village, in the home of 'Samto Kolhi and Kesar Bai.'

REASON OF WAR:

In February 1843, Britain launched an attack on Sindh under the command of Sir Charles Napier. In 1847, Sindh merged with the Bombay presidency. The British started levying taxes (Wong, J.Y., 1997).

The British government was able to collect fifty percent of its taxes. M.H. Panwhar argued that the "Sindh was conquered by Bombay army, at that time salary of a spy was six rupees, and according to Bombay army roles and regulations, if army work outside the Bombay presidency, the government paid extra seven and a half rupee allowance, therefore, the British government amalgamated Sindh with the Bombay presidency to save the allowance," (Dialogue, Sindh TV, August 2017).

Sodhas in Nangarparkar enjoyed autonomy and were exempt from paying taxes under Talpur control (Ojha, M. 2015: 91). The British utterly destroyed these tribes' integrity in this way. In 1856, the Commissioner of Hyderabad took charge of the region, establishing a new administrative policy and conducting a revenue survey. Following that, Mr. Deo Mal, a revenue official (Mukhtiarkar), was appointed to collect taxes from farmers. He enforced fees on grassland by force.

This revenue official had the authority to give the opium production license. Captain Tyrwhitt, the deputy commissioner of the Tharparkar region, supervised Deo Mal's activities. The British ideas were challenged by Karanji and Udhy Singh Poonjani Sodha of Ranpur, who refused to follow new orders about tax collection.

On the 15 of April 1859, a combat erupted between the Sodhas and the British as a result of the clash. Roplo Kolhi was recognized an expert in warfare among the farmers and warriors, thus he was chosen as the commander of the Kolhi battalion

"This fights resulted in the martyrdom of 5,000 Kolhi" (Kunbhar, N. 2014). Mr. Tyrwhitt had barely gotten away from the area. The commanding officer, colonel Aunis, led the 3rd Baloch regiment out of Hyderabad on April 24, 1859. During the conflict, Britain's companions and well-wishers were Jan Muhammad Khan Noon of Islamkot, Jani Lanjo, Malook Lanjo, Manjhi Mehranpoto, Raham Ali Wasaipoto, Akheraj Sodho of Bairi, Abbas Thebo, and Aakha Thakur.

Roplo Kolhi, his brother Dajoo Kolhi, and another Kolhi battled courageously and were Audhy Singh Sodho's allies. With modern weapons, they couldn't fight. As a result, they began fighting gorillas and took refuge in the Karonjhar mountain's "Chandan Gadh".

Finally, on the 3rd of May 1859, they went to war. Roplo, along with other freedom fighters, was captured. Roplo was tortured to physical and psychological, but he kept quiet about Audhysingh. On the evening of August 22, 1859, Ruplo Kolhi, Parker's great-grandson, was hanged out of an Acacia tree on the bank of the Guthro River (Encyclopedia Sindhiana, part six).

Roplo Kolhi's body was unknown to anyone. It, like Shaheed Sibghatullah Shah Rashid's, has

remained hidden till now. His commitment, bravery, honesty, passion for the motherland, andthe battle of the freedom warriors were all remembered in history. Every year, many Sindhi and Pakari Kolhi organisations celebrate the Roplo Kolhi anniversary in different cities and villages.



The seminar was organized in collaboration with Sindh Police Government of Sindh and Women Protection Cell, and Anti-Harassment Cell, University of Sindh.

The President of Women's Leadership Club Ms Sanam Altaf Chandio welcomed all the guests speakers and highlighted the aims and objectives of the Club. She said that the main purpose of the Club is to engage students in positive activities. In his





keynote speech, Professor Dr. Shuja Ahmed Mahesar Director Pakistan Study Centre University of Sindh Jamshoro emphasized on three 'Es' Education, Employment and Empowerment of women. Dr Shuja Ahmed further elaborated the objectives of Pakistan Study Centre according to Act of the Centre and highlighted the Centre's performance in teaching, research and community

services. He said that the main objective of the establishment of Women's Leadership Club is to achieve United Nations, Sustainable Development Goal (SDG's) Goal No.5 which is about gender equality. The Director analyzed the challenges faced by women which include domestic violence, gender discrimination and lack of safety at workplace. He said women's social status in social structure intoxicated with feudalistic values and patriarchal norms remains unchanged. Further, women's are neglected in the field of decision-making. Dr.



Shuja Ahmed stressed the need to ensure the participation of women as provided under the Article 34 of 1973 Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan.

Dr. Shuja Ahmed Mahesar further explored the factors for the emergence of women's leadership which include education, family support, self confidence and he argued that women leaders have proved themselves effective leaders in dealing with pandemic crisis. They have demonstrated substantial level of

resilience and capacity to sustain under dangerous circumstances created by pandemic virus. He further remarked that in order to improve the global gender index position; Pakistan needs to provide space to women leadership and women empowerment.



Prof. Dr. Naseem Aslam Channa, Chairperson Anti-Harassment Cell University of Sindh Jamshoro informed the audience about the support available at the Cell in case of harassment cases. The purpose of this cell is to work on 'enquiries or help out girls

students. She told the whole process of the cell and harassment cases.

Mr. Faheem Assistant Sub Inspector clearly defined various forms of harassment and also put some suggestions precautions measures to be taken by girls in order to be avoid harassment cases.



Ms Marvi Awan Director Women Protection Cell appreciated all activists, organizers, members including members of her team, police, women activists etc. She briefly enlightened the audience about the issues related to women and described the

strategy to cope with these issues. She admired the services of the Director Pakistan Study Centre and she said that Pakistan Study Centre has taken great initiatives for establishing various clubs for youth empowerment and engagement of students in creating awareness about gender issues. She said that the other departments of the University of Sindh should replicate the model of such clubs of the Centre.

Promoting youth and community participation in disaster response save lives

PROCEEDINGS

Seminar on *Earthquake in Pakistan: Causes, Consequences and Way Forward* was organised by Community Service Club of the Pakistan Study Centre, University of Sindh on Friday November 26, 2021. The Director of the Pakistan Study centre Professor Dr. Shuja Ahmed Mahesar welcomed all the speakers and attendees and thanked them for coming and participating in this most significant event. He informed the participants that Pakistan has a history of devastating natural disasters by the fact that many people were killed and affected in





the period from 1993-2002). Since 2002 more than four earthquakes exceeding magnitude 6 have struck Northern Pakistan and Balochistan region of Pakistan. More than 85,000 people lost their lives in the October 2005 Kashmir earthquake. He urged the participants and attendees that Disasters also bring opportunities to re-visit and develop sustainable plans to better cope up with the situation and save precious human lives, ecological and social dynamics of Pakistan. Disaster response becomes apt when officials, community members and youth work together and respond to disaster efficiently. We all should stand together and work as a Pakistani during this disaster to save our fellows. He shared his personal experience of conducting relief activities at Mansehra, Kulkara, Abbatabad and Balakot after the earthquake

occurred in 2005. Dr Shuja Mahesar said that, he led a University of Sindh student's team and worked at affected areas. The team established Medical Camp at Ayub Medical Complex and it distributed good among the victims and take efforts psychological rehabilitation and counseling. He further fled proved that in recognition of his services, Government of Pakistan in the field of Community Service, for the first time in Pakistan's history.

On the accession of the seminar the keynote speaker Dr. Rafique Ahmed Lashari, Director Centre for Pure and Applied Geology, the University of Sindh, Jamshoro said that Pakistan has successfully developed sound arrangements in terms of both institutional developments as well as in coordination between the various stakeholders for controlling river-flood related hazards and disasters. Dr. Lashari appreciated the PDMA, NDAM and ERRA response to the Kashmir earthquake 2005 and called an adequate witness to reach out to the most vulnerable





population after the earthquake.

He further told to the audiences that there is an undocumented but well-drilled preparedness plan for response, relief, and recovery, involving dedicated agencies and departments at the federal, provincial, and local government levels. The same is, however, not true for the rest of the disasters arising out of natural hazards such as flash floods, earthquakes, and landslides. in essence, Pakistan's entire focus on disaster preparedness relies on mobilization of the army corps or supply of relief items (tents, blankets, medicine, and food) through district relief offices. He concluded that Pakistan is located in the fault zone hence the country should use it as an opportunity to review its disaster management policy and develop a contingency plan to avoid any mega loss of human as well as infrastructure.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Abdul Razaque Channa remarked about that natural disasters have a severe impact on human life throughout history, because they always happened unexpectedly and rapidly. Since the disasters are happening quite frequently in Pakistan, the higher education institutes as well our colleges and schools should teach this course so our youth should understand and learn to respond timely and in professional way. He further emphasized the value of local knowledge regarding disaster management and involvement of the community in pre-post disaster response, recovery and rehabilitation and reconstruction.



Monday 29-11-2021

One-day career counselling workshop on "CIVIL SERVICE REFORMS AND CSS EXAMINATION" was organised by Research and Academic Club of the Pakistan Study Centre, University of Sindh, in collaboration with Centre for Research and Social Development (CRSD) and Sports and Youth Affairs Department Government of Sindh on Monday November 29, 2021.



The Director of the Pakistan Study Centre Professor Dr. Shuja Ahmed Mahesar welcomed all the speakers and participants and thanked them for coming and participating in this most important event. Dr. Shuja Ahmed Mahesar argued that rule of law has become indispensable for peace and development. For implementing rule of law, institutions including bureaucracy can play vital role. He said, Pakistan inherited a bureaucratic system which owed its structure to Indian Civil Service (ICS) and it continued administrative legacies, traditions and values of its predecessor.

Dr. Mahesar explored the factors of political instability and inept political system which created opportunity for bureaucracy to step in to fill the power vacuum and monopolize power during the past several decades. He further talked about the need for reforms in civil service structure, Dr Mahesar said that Pakistan needs efficient and transparent public service with ability to innovate and improvise local resources for the benefit of people.



He further said for effective delivery of public services, bureaucracy needs administrative competence which comes through professional education, experience, training, career advancement, security of tenure, freedom of work, leadership style, teamwork skills and exercise of powers as per law. Dr Mahesar said that we need bureaucracy with vision and ability of understanding challenges. Thus, the efforts for reforming bureaucracy must be aimed at increasing effectiveness and bureaucratic competence while keeping eye on future needs of our society.

Assistant Commissioner Hazim Bhangwar delivered a motivational speech about competitive examination. He described his role in the government and his journey of becoming an officer. He further engaged the students and discussed hard work and work

ethics and stated that "one should never stop pushing further, because in the end it's worth it".



Mr. Ashique Hussain Khoso (CSP) delivered his lecture regarding the preparation of (CSS) examination and answered the queries CSS of aspirants during the session. He said, it is very important that the candidates must understand the causes and effects of different issues and events. For, the attempting question papers they must focus on these

dimension. The candidates are often found studying the unnecessary details and irrelevant aspects. He further briefed that the candidates should rely more on electronic sources. They should make study plan follow 3R's Strategy: Read, Repeat, Retain.




