### **TRAININGS AND AWARENESS**

#### **Introduction:**

Pakistan has a coastal line of about 990 km, out of this Sindh coastal zone is about 350 km which support to the world 7<sup>th</sup> largest mangrove forest and Indus Delta RAMSAR site an International Heritage. The Sindh coastal area in Pakistan is a disaster prone area that is frequently affected by natural calamities such as, cyclones, rains, floods and some time droughts. Keeping in view the regional challenges, the Centre for Coastal and Deltaic Studies (CCDS), University of Sindh Pakistan aim to produce trained human resource by providing higher education, applied natured research, technical trainings and awareness on climate change impacts, coastal ecosystems and biodiversity of Marine and coastal environment. Applied nature trainings are being arranged at coastal villages on fish culture development in the connection of two marine research projects funded by Petroleum Marine Development Committee PMDC Sujawal and PMDC Thatta. The project titles are given below.

#### **Explanation:**

Disseminated awareness related to climate change impacts, conservation of natural resources and minimization of aquatic pollution especially focused on plastic and chemical pollution impacts on fish and fisheries and drinking waters.

More than 100 trainings related to ecological conservation of mangroves, fish culture development, drinking water purification and early warning systems are organized during last 2 years (copies of Certificates are attached). Environmental conservation awareness programs and sessions among coastal community at villages, cities and capital places have been organized. The major focus of the awareness are the environmental conservations of biodiversity, livelihood, coastal vulnerable community, fish culture development, mangrove forest development, disaster risk reduction, livelihood options, WASH, Socio-economic development and green Pakistan, solutions to minimize plastic pollution. iv. Published and printed training manuals, booklets, brochures, calendars, pictorial messages related to healthy environment, water testing and purification, applications of modern technology.

Published awareness brochures, calendars and conservation manuals on under size catches of endangered and threatened fish species of *Tenualosa ilisha*, *Macrobrachium rosenbergi* and *M. malcomsoni* in collaboration to District administration of Thatta, Sujawal, Jamshoro and Hyderabad, Sindh Pakistan. The awareness materials are publishing in English and local languages Urdu and Sindhi. In the environment awareness; the research scholars, university students, community peoples, officials and officers politicians, policy makers and legislators are participating and engaging. More than 35000 awareness calendars are distributed among stakeholders. Five thousand copies of calendars printed on mangrove forest conservation, 10,000 calendars on conservation of migratory fish *Tenualosa ilisha* (Palla), 20,000 copies of annual calendars were printed on minimization of plastic pollution “Solutions to plastic pollution. The same were distributed among all stakeholders during and after a seminar on World Environment Day June 05, 2023 being organized at University of Sindh Jamshoro and Karachi, Thatta, Sujawal and Badin districts of Sindh.

I am writing to you in reference to your conversation with my colleague, Khurram Saeed.

As you may be aware, the CHS Alliance, Sphere and Groupe URD have launched a multi-stakeholder consultation process to collect feedback on how to update and improve the Core Humanitarian Standard (CHS).

Community World Service Asia is conducting consultation process in the region which is being led by the Q&A team under which consultative meetings, focus groups discussions and workshops are being planned with different organisations.
